







Overview

The Ideas Youth Committee (IYC) initiatedoff their engagement process with two meetings. The Kick off meeting was held on October 16, 2024 with in person and virtual options available. At the kick off meeting, expectations for the IYC were set, the timeline was explained, and a general project overview was presented.

The IYC will:

- Give young people a platform to express their opinions, ideas, and concerns.
- Ensure their voices are heard and considered in what they like currently about City Park, what changes could be made, and what new programming could take place in the Park.
- Provide an opportunity for members to learn more about urban Parks, community service, and improving quality of life.



After the presentations, IYC members were given the opportunity to explore and observe sections of the Park that they haven't normally experienced. Youth were given an "Explore City Park" activity sheet to complete in their free time. With a keyed map of City Park, IYC members were invited to visit an area of City Park to document their observations, critiques, and ideas for that area.

The locations that youth visited and observations that were shared were written on post-it notes and placed on a large-scale map of City Park in the room. This map is intended to be a running list of IYC member ideas and contributions.



Overview - Table Activity

The first interactive in person meeting took place on October 23rd, 2024 above Café du Monde in City Park. It started with a brief presentation bringing the IYC up to speed where the project is currently. Then over twenty IYC members participated in an interactive round-table activity envisioning their ideal City Park.









IYC Members were asked to brainstorm elements, activities, and ideas they would like to have in their ideal park. They were given some reference images to help start the brainstorm. They were asked to write their ideas on four different color post-it notes to categorize their ideas. Finally, they were asked to develop core foundational themes that represent their ideal future City Park. The results are summarized on the

Ideas Brainstorm

Participants were asked to brainstorm programs, activities, areas, or anything else they'd like to see in City Park. They were given different color post-it notes to categorize their ideas. The categories were Events & Gathering Spaces, Nature Activities & Green Space, Play & Action Sports, and Other. The most common ideas and themes from each category are summarized below. Full results are in the appendix.

Events & Gathering Spaces

Participants suggested adding more events and spaces to bring community together. Some ideas included outdoor movies, farmers market & food trucks, and art markets. They also suggested community class options like yoga, gardening, and acrobatics.

Nature Activities & Green Space


Participants focused a lot on nature exploration and wildlife observation opportunities like a butterfly garden and bird sanctuary. They also discussed adding trails, nature tours, and water-based life. Ideas included interactive signage to help identify animals or plants. There was strong interest in gardening spaces, community orchards, and classes for growing food. Participants discussed water and boating activities including kayak and canoe rentals coupled with maps for interesting routes.

Play & Action Sports

Participants reiterated multiple times for general upkeep of existing facilities, paths, and trails along with clear directional signage. There was significant interest in adding covered basketball courts, a skate Park, volleyball courts, splash pads, zip-lines, and a climbing wall. Participants also discussed adding more age-appropriate options for young adults and teenagers to existing programs like the amusement Park.

Other

Participants focused on transportation and signage while brainstorming "Other" ideas. Participants wanted clearer navigation signage and transportation options such as trolleys throughout the Park, bike sharing, and general public transportation. Participants also discussed developing more night time events and programming. Lastly, participants highlighted their desire to the Park, its events, and programming accessible and affordable to New Orleans residents.



The graph above shows the number of ideas generated by each category across all activity sheets.

Themes for City Park

After brainstorming their ideas for things to include in an ideal City Park, Youth Committee members were asked about themes. Participants wrote down the major themes that should be foundational to the park. Similar ideas are summarized below. The full list of themes are in the appendix and below.

The most commonly repeated theme focused on connecting people with restorative nature. Participants ideas included "can allow you to connect with nature," "allows you to escape the busy city life," and access to "wild, restoring spaces". Another repeated theme focused on building community and culture for all of New Orleans. Ideas included "brings people together," "a place to share cultural experiences," and "a place to create memories with friends and family."

Other themes included making the entire park accessible and affordable, promoting creativity, inspiration, and learning, and making the park engaging, fun, and memorable.

After Action Review

After the activity was completed, each participant was asked to fill out an After Action Review. The summary of their responses are below.

What new things did you learn about City Park during this meeting?

Many participants learned about the size and variety of activities within City Park. They also highlighted learning about the waterways, specifically poor water circulation and drainage in the lagoon. Some participants reflected on the park's history, including its connection to Native lands and its historical development.

List 1-3 positive outcomes of the meeting.

Participants enjoyed meeting new people, connecting with others who share a passion for improving City Park. Participants like the idea generation and opportunity to share new and creative ideas for park improvements. Many participants felt heard and empowered to keep sharing ideas and give their input.

Do you have any additional concerns, questions, or comments?

Only a few participants responded to this question. Out of the ones that did, the most common request was to have the opportunity to see future design propositions and be able to weigh in on those designs.

Do you have any suggestions for improvements?

Participants are looking forward to more collaboration and encouraged switching up seating arrangements to be able to discuss with different people at the next meeting.

Next Steps

The next IYC Meeting will take place on November 20th at the Parkview Terrace room from 4:30 - 6:30 pm. This meeting will build on the themes and ideas developed at this meeting and integrate it with the core intentions developed by the previous large community meetings and the design team.
